Remote Home Learning

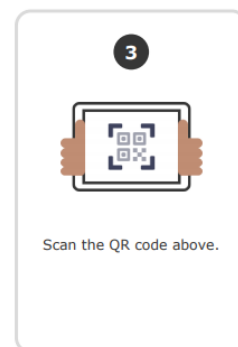
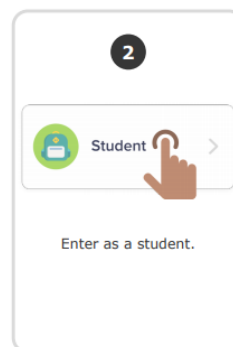
Your children should be coming home tonight with an individual login QR code in order to access remote home learning via a learning platform called Class Dojo – which some of you may already be familiar with. It will be on a letter or possibly on a sticker in the back of a homework book for some children. Older children should be able to join their classroom community by logging on using the camera on their phones, tablets or laptops and pointing it at the QR code and following the instructions. If you do not have compatible technology for QR code reading, let us know and we can provide alternate ways to access Class Dojo. Younger children might need your help to login to their class account from home. It will look something like this:

Teachers have already started to set home learning tasks via this platform for their classes, so children can now start accessing these activities from home and can send learning back electronically to their teacher who can then provide feedback to individuals if necessary. In the possible event of children being asked to follow public health advice to stay at home or should whole classes be asked to stay at home for a period of time, we will be using this platform from now on to communicate learning, provide feedback and also present videos of teachers explaining tasks as and when necessary.

Nursery and Little Teds' parents, please make sure that you have given the adults in nursery your email addresses so that you can connect to this platform and see your children's learning journey.

If you experience any difficulties using the technology, or are unable to access it due to not having compatible devices at home, please speak to the class teachers and they will endeavor to support you as best they can. They are getting used to using it themselves though, so they may not have all of the answers yet, so please bear with them.
